



FORMATION OUR FAITH IN THE FUTURE Luca Lanasa

Luca Lanasa is one of the youngest seminarians at just 19 years of age! He is in the process of completing his propaedeutic year in seminary, and his enthusiasm and joyfulness are contagious to all he meets. Luca came from a very Catholic family and was inspired at a young age by his mother who, he stated, was always very devout. He attended St. Peter's in Lewiston where he began serving Mass and has continued doing so ever since. Luca said, *"My inspiration comes from the Mass and being on the altar serving God which gives me great joy!"*

Raised in a very busy and bustling home, Luca was the youngest of four and they had the opportunity to stay right on campus with him boys. He felt that his years growing up were pretty typical - playing in the guest house. A three-week break at Christmas when all the propaedeutic seminarians were able to go home and be with their sports, spending time with friends, listening to music, and going to prom were just a few things he remembers fondly. When asked about families was very much treasured by all! his calling, Luca stated "It came in a very subtle way, very guiet, gradual and gentle. There was no major moment just a seed that kept growing After this propaedeutic year, Luca will attend Gannon University in Erie, *slowly and firmly.*" He looks forward to the journey ahead and fully Pa. to earn his bachelor's degree, a prerequisite before entering seminary. understands that discernment is his greatest priority. If asked today, 'Will Upon graduation, he will return to St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore, you continue to pursue this path despite all the challenges?' the answer Maryland, which will be a 7-9 year process of discernment and education. would be a resounding YES!"

Luca is enjoying his first year in seminary very much. When asked to lead us through a typical day, he said that the day begins with prayers followed by Mass and breakfast. The morning is dedicated to classroom time with a main formator and director leading the class. He finds the theology and philosophy classes engaging, with lively discussions that challenge the seminarians to think critically and develop logical reasoning. Luca went on to say that "Something else of great importance is the brotherhood I am experiencing with my seven fellow propaedeutic classmates. This is a new family for me and one that I am happy to be a part of! We do everything together- we eat, pray, play games... everything!" Luca's classmates span quite an age range from 18-45 years old.

When asked the question regarding how difficult the initial "technology fast" was, Luca felt it was good to take a break from his cell phone and all the social media. The difficulty for him was not being able to text his mom and dad and his family support system. However, three weeks came and went and the "fast" was over. Luca was excited to say that his parents and grandmother were able to visit him at St. Mary's Seminary

Please keep Luca and all our seminarians in your prayers. Your support is so important to them while they discern if God is truly calling them to the priesthood. Just knowing you are there supporting and praying for them means the world to Luca and all the seminarians!

RESPONSE TO LOVE CENTER Sr. Johnice Rzadkiewicz

Sr. Mary Johnice is a Felician nun who has devoted her entire life to education! When she was studying for a Masters degree in Philadelphia, she had the rare privilege of meeting Mother Teresa who happened to be seated at her table. Sr. Johnice told Mother Teresa "*Mother, we have a building and I would like to work with the poor but I don't know how. Can I come...can I come to Calcutta with you and learn?*" Mother Teresa responded, "*No. Go back to your neighborhood and find Calcutta.*" Sr. Johnice persevered, "But Mother, how do I do that?" Mother Teresa responded "They will come. And when they do, you look them in the eyes and you will find Jesus. These will be your people and they will be the ones that you serve."

Though Sr. Johnice could have continued with teaching children in Catholic elementary schools, she started a new mission mid-life. This new merciful mission of serving the poorest of the poor, inspired by faith and love for the less fortunate, improves the lives of so many across the Western New York community. Sr. Johnice and her Team lovingly address basic human needs while helping those they serve to become more self-sufficient. The Response to Love Center, located on Buffalo's East side, serves a multicultural community with a food pantry respecting the diverse choices and taste preferences of all those who enter seeking food, clothing, and education. Warm and nutritious daily meals are served to feed the hungry, a daunting task but not so for the many enthusiastic volunteers who emulate the spirit and love that Sr. Johnice demonstrates daily. The Response to Love

Center is a beacon of hope for those not just feeding the body but also their souls and giving them hope for better days to come. Hope through food and clothing, hope through education opening doors to each person's future, and hope through spirituality and faith that a better day lies ahead.

Sr. Johnice firmly believes that her role as an educator continues at the Response to Love Center, though in a different way. She now educates those less fortunate. As she feeds the hungry each day, she is a light in the darkness for those who have nowhere to turn. "*There but for the grace of God go I*," is something that Sr. Johnice lives daily. Each day, she opens the doors to the Response to Love Center and, with a warm and welcoming smile, she changes lives by treating those she serves with dignity and love. Her gentle, caring, and compassionate way assures those going through challenging times that God is good and that there is hope for a brighter day.


